What a year 2023 was! The Library added book lockers for 24/7 pick-ups, expanded our hours, added new outreach programs throughout the community, welcomed 2,992 new library holders, and much more. Thank you to the volunteers who contributed 8,068 hours last year to help make this possible. Our patrons saved \$3,051,702.71 in 2023 by borrowing books and other materials from the library instead of purchasing them new. This number only includes physical items checked out from the library, can you imagine the cost savings if we included our digital resources and library programs?

AARP Foundation volunteers will be returning for the popular Tax-Aide program, offering free tax help to community members.
