Why you should not Feed Deer Corn – I LOVE DEER, but the sheer numbers of them have effectively made them a residential nuisance and a significant traffic hazard. See page 3 for the reasons why you should not feed the deer!

Deer Resistant Ground Cover

12 years ago, when I bought my house nearby, about 40% of my front yard was filled with beautiful Jasmine ground cover in flower beds. Now, there is none alive due to the deer, yet in my backyard my Jasmine thrives. Last year, I discovered four new ground covers that the deer have not eaten and I'm beginning to reclaim my flowerbeds. For your consideration:

- Trailing Lantana The plants grow sideways more than up. Each plant can cover about 4 square feet in a circle and can be trimmed. Lantana does freeze over the winter and requires trimming before regrowth. Flower colors vary.
- Texas Frogfruit Smaller low-level plants that survive winter pretty
 well. Once established is pretty aggressive in expanding. It displays
 white flowers from April to October and pollinators (insects and
 butterflies) love it.
- Vinca Major (Periwinkle) DOES NOT FREEZE OVER WINTER and LOOKS GREAT ALL YEAR ROUND. Hard to find, but much better than Vinca Minor (which is more easily

found). These plants with blue flowers spread like crazy. Once established you can transplant the runners to other parts of the yard. Vinca needs water and insects can be a challenge.

 Sedge Grass – Ryan Schultz (Schultz Landscaping) reports that they take a little water to help get established but once they do perform really well.

Why you should not Feed Deer Corn - Newcomers to Texas are often amazed by the deer presence in our neighborhoods. Unfortunately, there are so many deer in our Shavano Park neighborhoods that their presence is not an occasional thrilling sighting; and for many it is a daily event. Not just 1 or 2x, but in some areas 8-15x. These herds of deer travel through our neighborhoods eating almost everything in reach like garbage deposals – devastating much of our residential landscape. During drought, the over populated deer will eat things they normally won't. One of the most popular area ground covers is Jasmine – previously considered deer resistant and protected, the deer have now resorted to gobbling it down as well.

Folks feed deer corn for many reasons, but primarily it is attracting these majestic animals for viewing enjoyment or it is because they think by feeding them corn that they are helping them survive.

Did you know:

- Corn (high-carbohydrate) to a deer is like a candy bar to a kid... it
 tastes good... but is not a natural food source for deer; the nutrient
 content of corn is not ideal for deer, as it is low in protein.
- Feeding corn to deer can cause digestion problems
- Feeding corn concentrates to the deer in small areas where a variety of infectious diseases can be spread
- Feeding corn encourages them to leave the greenbelts and seek other food in the neighborhoods
- Unfortunately, the primary deer population control in our neighborhoods is Northwest Military Highway and De Zavala. I would estimate that 15-25 deer are killed annually; usually hit and wandering off
- In a one-year period 2023-24, there were approximately 92,500 deer accidents in Texas causing significant vehicle damage and many injuries

Why does it seem like every company is asking me to setup a Passkey?

A passkey is a new, more secure way to sign in to apps and websites — without using a password. Instead of something you have to remember and type (like a traditional password), a passkey uses biometrics (like Face ID or fingerprint), a device PIN, or a special USB security key to log you in. Passkeys use public and private keys cryptography. When you create a passkey on a website or app, the company gets a public key and you store a private key encrypted on the passkey provider (for example Google Password Manager). Any future time you access the website or app the public and private keys are matched to secure the connection and log you onto the website or app without a password.

Passkey Benefits:

- No passwords to remember
- Phishing-resistant attackers can't trick you into giving them your passkey
- Faster logins
- Cross-device sync (like through iCloud Keychain or Google Password Manager)

Companies are pushing passkeys because they solve a ton of problems that come with passwords. Passwords people create are generally weak while Passkeys are phishing-resistant, can't be reused, and can't be leaked in database breaches. Fewer password resets also mean fewer support requests and less frustration for customers. Companies also can save money on password reset servers, customer support and security database breaches. Big players like Apple, Amazon, Google, Microsoft are all backing passkeys. That means the tech is being built into devices, browsers, and platforms by default. As support grows, companies are jumping on board to stay current and competitive.

Well great you say, but how do I set up and starting using a passkey? Always follow the instructions given to you by the website/app you are trying to access. Here is a simple guide for setting up passkeys on an iPhone.

How to Set Up a Passkey on iPhone

To use Passkeys on an iPhone you need iOS 16 or later, iCloud Keychain turned on, and Face ID or Touch ID set up.

- 1. Go to a supported website or app like Google, Amazon, eBay, or Passkeys.io (for testing)
- 2. Log in to your account (if you're not already)
- 3. Go to Security or Sign-in Settings and look for something like: "Create a passkey" or "Enable passwordless login" or "Add passkey"
- 4. Follow the prompts. You'll be asked to: Authenticate with Face ID or Touch ID and confirm you want to save the passkey to your iCloud Keychain.
- 5. Done! Next time you log in to that site/app, it'll offer the passkey as an option. You just use Face ID / Touch ID no password needed.

You can view your saved passkeys: Go to Settings > Passwords and Use Face ID to unlock. Then tap a website to see if it has a passkey saved.

Honoring 70 Years of Shavano Park Pride

During calendar year 2026, the City of Shavano Park will be recognizing 70 years since its incorporation back in 1956. Over those years, the city and surrounding area has seen such unpredictable growth that even our founding leaders could not have expected!!

In looking for a way to celebrate this upcoming milestone, I reflected on the best way to honor our past from a law enforcement perspective

Last summer during the fiscal year 2025 budget process, I presented an idea to city leaders to develop, purchase and wear 70th anniversary commemorative badges for our police department. The notion was to seek funding during the fiscal year, and use the year leading up to Shavano Park's birthday, for research and development; then allow officers to wear the commemorative badges during the entire calendar year of 2026.

The vision I had, took off outside of the budget process when Alderman Lee Powers and Alderman Pete Miller decided to spearhead the project and seek sponsors to financially support it, without utilizing city funds. Within a couple months, Alderman Powers and Miller had completely sponsored 22 commemorative badges, through 16 different families and associations, just by word of mouth.

I'm proud to say, we have developed the commemorative badge and it is currently in production. Our intent is to hold a public ceremony in December and allow those sponsors to 'pin' the badge onto each officer.

Pool and Water Safety

Hello everyone! As the warm weather returns, we will start heading out to the pool, lake, or beach to cool down. Whether it's a trip to the beach or a dip in the community or backyard pool, these swimming safety tips can help you have fun in the sun.

Death and injury from drowning happen every day in pools; natural bodies of water; toilets; bathtubs; and even buckets. The statistics are staggering: ten people drown every day for a total of 3,400 each year. It's a leading cause of accidental death among children of all ages and the single leading cause of injury-related death among children ages one to four.

Although swimming lessons don't necessarily prevent drowning and are not a substitute for adult supervision, it's important to teach children to swim. According to the American Academy of Pediatrics, most children age four and older can learn to swim. Children ages one to four might be able to learn depending on their physical and emotional development. Several organizations, such as the American Red Cross, Boys & Girls Clubs, YMCAs and municipal and neighborhood pools provide lowcost and even free swimming lessons.

The key to preventing these heartbreaking disasters is education and knowledge. Instill a culture of water safety by following these best practices.

- Stay Close, Be Alert and Watch
- Always watch children and never leave them unattended
- Keep children away from pool drains, pipes and other openings
- Have a charged phone close by at all times
- If a child is missing, check the pool first
- Share safety instructions with family, friends and neighbors
- Learn and Practice Water Safety Skills
- Learn to swim and make sure kids do, too
- Know how to perform CPR on children and adults
- Understand the basics of life saving so that you can assist in a pool emergency
- Have the Appropriate Equipment
- Install a fence of at least four feet in height around the perimeter of the pool or spa
- Use self-closing and self-latching gates
- Ensure all pools and spas have compliant drain covers
- Install an alarm on the door leading from the house to the pool
- Keep pool and spa covers in working order
- Have life-saving equipment such as life rings or reaching poles available for use

On April 11, 2025, the Bexar Appraisal District (BCAD) mailed the 2025 Notices of Appraised Value to new property owners and to those whose property market value has increased by \$1,000 or more compared to the previous year. Property owners have until May 15, 2025, or 30 days after receiving their notice to appeal their appraised value.



TREE COMMITTEE

Did you know? The City of Shavano Park updated our tree trimming schedule. In order to prevent the spread of oak-wilt disease all commercial tree trimming contractors in the City of Shavano Park are required to register with www.MyGovernmentOnline.org. The annual contractor registration fee is \$50.00 and the registration forms are available at www.MyGovernmentOnline.org – 1-866-957-3764. If a contractor is the one trimming the oak trees, they are responsible for pulling a commercial tree trimming permit. Both contractors, and residents alike are required to purchase tree trimming permits prior to trimming any species of oak trees during the designated tree trimming seasons.

The cost of a residential tree trimming permit is \$35.00, and is valid from the date of issuance for a period of one (1) year (365 days). Residential tree trimming permits are available at www.MyGovernmentOnline.org and may also be purchased at City Hall. The cost of a Commercial tree trimming permit is \$35.00, and is valid for a period of (14) days from the date of issuance. Permits are only available through www.MyGovernmentOnline. org. Both commercial businesses and residents may only trim trees during the designated tree trimming season of **JULY 1ST THROUGH JANUARY 31ST.**

OAK TREE TRIMMING REQUIREMENTS:

- ALL EQUIPMENT USED FOR TRIMMING MUST BE PROPERLY DISINFECTED, I.E. LYSOL
- ALL WOUNDS SHALL BE PAINTED IMMEDIATELY, BUT NO LATER THAN ½ HOUR AFTER MAKING
- THE CUTS (does not have to be a tar-based paint can be a regular can of black spray paint).

BOTH COMMERCIAL CONTRACTORS AND RESIDENTS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR REMOVING ALL DEBRIS FROM THE SITE WITHIN 48 HOURS AFTER CUTTING.

Please remember, if you are doing your own tree trimming – any trees that hang over the streets should be trimmed up at least 14' feet from the street. All shrubbery should be trimmed back at least 3' feet from the curb in order to keep the fire hydrants accessible in the event of a fire. Those who live on corner lots, please trim any shrubbery that limits a driver's vision when pulling out into another street. Emergency vehicles and buses are particularly vulnerable in this area and we need to be careful with the children who ride these buses.
