Preparing for disasters in advance can have a big impact on your safety and recovery in an emergency. You have the power to protect yourself, your loved ones, and our community. Make emergency preparedness your superpower!

There are four key steps to being prepared for an emergency. Following these four steps can make it easier before, during, and after any disaster that may strike.

- 1. Make a Plan
- 2. Build a Kit
- 3. Know Your Neighbors
- 4. Stay Informed

Make a Plan

Don't put off planning for an emergency! Discuss with your family how you will respond, stay informed, and contact one another during emergency situations in which key services like electricity, water, or first responders may not be available. Once your initial plan has been created, make it a point to discuss it at least once a year and make updates as needed.

A family plan should include:

- A designated place to meet if you are separated outside your home, or nearby.
- A plan to contact one another if you are unable to meet or get separated during a crisis.
- Public safety phone numbers (i.e. police, fire, and hospital) for your area.
- An out-of-area contact to communicate that you are safe and learn the status of the other family members.
- * There are some situations where you may decide to "Bug-In" instead of leaving your home. There are more things to plan for if you stay home. Consider firewood, self-defense, and other preparations to facilitate feeling

Build a Kit

Make a Basic Emergency Supply Kit O Basic first aid kit, seven-day supply of medications/medical items O 1 gallon of water per person, per day (7-day supply) O 7-day supply of non-perishable food, can opener O Map(s) of the area O Battery-powered or hand-crank radio (NOAA Weather Radio, if possible) O Extra cash (suggested: \$200 in small bills) O Spare change of clothes O Cell phone, charger(s), flashlight, extra batteries O Spare car/home key O Sanitation, personal hygiene items, blankets O Family and emergency contact info (phone and email) O Wrench or plyer O Other tools or equipment you may need O Pet supplies (collar, leash, tags, food, bowl) O Copies of personal documents in water-tight bag Get Ready√ ✓ For more information readycentraltexas.org **Central Texas**

Know Your Neighbors

Neighbors helping neighbors enhances community resilience and ensures that emergency resources will reach those in the greatest need. If you can help one of your neighbors, that could be one less emergency call that needs to be made. Reducing the strain on emergency services by helping each other can add up to make a big difference in a crisis. All this means that knowing your neighbors and identifying those who might need extra help during a disaster is critical to increasing Austin's disaster preparedness.

You can prepare yourself and then get involved in the community to encourage disaster preparedness:

- Learn CPR and basic first aid. It may save the life of a loved one or neighbor.
- Take Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training.
- Organize your neighborhood, homeowners' association, apartment complex, or building to better prepare where you live for a disaster.

Stay Informed

Knowing where you can get reliable information during an emergency is crucial. During a disaster, unreliable websites and social media can have incorrect, out of date, or even false information. It is important to know ahead of time where you will get critical updates about what is going on in the community.

Take the following steps now so you are better informed from reliable sources when disaster strikes:

- Warn Central Texas: Sign up for Warn Central Texas to receive emergency alerts letting you know when you need to take immediate action to stay safe. WarnCentralTexas.org
- Accessible Hazard Alert System (AHAS): Austin HSEM and the Travis County Office of Emergency Management have partnered with Deaf Link to launch the Accessible Hazard Alert System (AHAS) for Deaf, Blind, Hard of Hearing, or Deaf and Blind community.

Austin and Travis County AHAS subscribers receive an accessible message in American Sign Language, and English voice and text. The alert message will include information about the emergency and what actions to take. AHAS can send accessible alerting messages to registered residents before, during, and after an emergency or disaster in Travis County.

When an emergency alert or other information is sent through the AHAS program, users will receive accessible alert messages on internet and video capable devices such as computers, cell phones, smart phones, tablet computers, and wireless Braille readers. FREE Resource for Yard Trimmings and Large Brush Drop Off

Drop-off details: The Hornsby Bend Biosolids Management Plant will be accepting material from Austin and Travis County residents only, free of charge. Individuals residing outside of Austin and Travis County should consult their municipality for options.

Austin and Travis County residents can drop yard trimmings and large brush at Austin Water's Hornsby Bend Biosolids Management Plant (2210 FM 973, Austin, TX) 8:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m., Monday-Saturday. The material will be composted and made into Dillo Dirt.

Accepted material: Tree limbs, Branches, Shrubs, Leaves

Not accepted material:

Certain materials cannot be composted and therefore are not accepted in this drop-off program. These include: Treated or painted lumber, Particle board, Construction materials, Trash

- A government-issued photo ID is required for entry.
- The drop off will be self-serve.
- Staff will be available on-site to direct traffic and verify all material is free of trash and contamination.
- The grounds are muddy and could be slippery. Proper footwear is recommended.
