The Great Springs Project

In Texas, we have been gifted with nature in abundance. We have the Hill Country, with lush trees and rolling terrain. We also have springs trickling from secret spaces beneath ancient rocks, providing both Austin and San Antonio with water.



Now, an organization called the Great Springs

Project is attempting to create a hiking trail that would connect Austin to San Antonio, along a path that includes Barton Springs, San Marcos Springs, Comal Springs, and San Antonio Springs. This corridor will be connected by a network of spring-to-spring trails, linking the four iconic springs of Central Texas together. While some of these sites already have existing trails, this project would link them all together into a single trail. This one trail will stretch for over 100 miles. Eventually, trail users will be able to walk or bike from the Alamo to the Capitol.

Some folks may be skeptical. However, the organization has already connected over 30 miles of trails and is in discussions to purchase more land. The group does not use eminent domain to obtain land, except when requested by the landowner. They are also willing to negotiate easements.

Of course, this process takes time. The project is expected to be completed by 2036 – twelve years from now. The US Department of the Interior estimates that up to 50000 acres of land will be protected by this project.

The Great Springs Project is expected to be funded by the US Government, along with individual donations, both large and small.

- Supervise Children: Never leave a child unattended in the water.
- Teach Swimming: Swimming skills significantly reduce the risk of accidents in the water.
- CPR Knowledge: Learn CPR. Knowing how to perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) can be a lifesaver during emergencies.
- Avoid Pool Drains: Drains can pose entrapment hazards, and it's essential to educate kids about their dangers.
- Install Safety Equipment:
- Fences: Install fences around the pool area to prevent unsupervised access.
- Alarms: Consider pool alarms that alert you if someone enters the water.
- Pool Covers: Use pool covers when the pool is not in use.
- Float Liners: These can help keep children afloat.
- Life Preservers: Keep life preservers nearby.
- Pool Safety Hooks: These can assist in rescuing someone who's struggling in the water.
- Regular Inspections and Maintenance:
- **Drains and Covers:** Regularly inspect drains and drain covers to ensure they're functioning correctly.
- Pool Chemistry: Maintain proper pool chemistry to prevent health risks.
- First Aid Kit: Prepare a first aid kit with essential supplies.
- Take the Pool Safety Pledge: Commit to pool safety by taking the pledge.
- · Remember, pool safety is everyone's responsibility.

- Plant mosquito repelling plants on your property like citronella, basil, catnip and lavender.
