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CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS BRAUN STATION EAST 17 September 1975

Section 10. Use of Temporary Structures: No structure of a temporary character, trailer, basement, tent, shack, garage, barn or other outbuilding shall be used on any lot at any time as a residence. Temporary structures used as building offices and for other related purposes during the construction period must be approved by the Architectural Control Committee as outlined in Article I, Section 2.

Invoices will be mailed out in November. Payments are due January 1, 2025. Late charges will apply on all payments made after January 31.

Payments may be mailed, dropped off at the office, or dropped in the mail slot beside the office door at 9350 Knighthood. Payments must be postmarked no later than January 31 to avoid late fees.

Remember that your assessments are the main source of income for the association. It is used for the upkeep of our clubhouse, recreational facilities, pools, and common grounds as well as our social programs (with the exception of the Christmas Village which has been maintained exclusively with donations from sponsors). We work very hard to keep all costs down and to be good stewards of your assessments for the benefit of the neighborhood.

WHAT IS A PROXY and WHY DO WE NEED IT?

Each January BSE residents, as members of the Association, must vote to approve the annual budget and to elect members to the Board of Directors.

If there are not enough voters present or voting by proxy, votes for the proposed annual budget and board members cannot take place, leaving the Association unable to conduct business.

If you cannot attend the January meeting, please consider naming someone to vote for you by proxy. You may name any member in good standing who will be attending. To do this, complete the Proxy form and return to the office prior to the meeting.
