Safely Viewing a Total Solar Eclipse

On April 8, the Texas Hill Country and the northwest half of San Antonio will experience a total solar eclipse. This is a breathtaking celestial event where the moon passes between the Earth and the sun, blocking out its light for a brief period.

While witnessing this phenomenon can be an awe-inspiring experience, it's crucial to prioritize safety when viewing a solar eclipse to prevent any damage to your eyes. Here's a guide on how to safely view a total solar eclipse:

■ Use solar viewing glasses: Invest in a pair of solar viewing glasses that meet the ISO 12312-2 international

safety standards. These glasses are specially designed to filter out harmful ultraviolet, visible, and infrared radiation while allowing you to observe the eclipse safely. Ensure that your glasses are not scratched or damaged, as this can compromise their effectiveness. They can be purchased at H-E-B, Wal-Mart, Target and similar stores; or online. However, don't wait too long; they will sell out fast as the date approaches.

- DIY pinhole projector: If you don't have access to solar viewing glasses, you can create a simple pinhole projector using cardboard, aluminum foil, and a piece of white paper. Poke a small hole in the center of the cardboard, cover it with aluminum foil, and then make a pinhole in the foil. Position the projector so that the sunlight passes through the pinhole and projects an image of the eclipse onto the white paper.
- Telescopes and binoculars: If you plan to use telescopes or binoculars to view the eclipse, ensure that they are equipped with solar filters specifically designed for safe solar viewing. Never look directly at the sun through these optical devices without proper filtration, as doing so can cause permanent eye damage.
- Avoid unfiltered cameras and smartphones: Never point an unfiltered camera or smartphone directly at the sun, as the intense light can damage the camera sensor or the eyes of anyone looking through the viewfinder. If you want to photograph the eclipse, use a solar filter specifically designed for cameras.

Supervise children closely during the eclipse and make sure they understand the importance of not looking directly at the sun without protection. Encourage them to wear solar viewing glasses or use pinhole projectors to observe the eclipse safely.

By following these safety precautions, you can enjoy the aweinspiring beauty of a total solar eclipse without putting your eyes at risk. Remember that protecting your vision is paramount when witnessing this rare celestial event.



Keep Your Cool: Trustworthy AC Repair Tips

Slowly but surely, that famous Texas heat is returning and will be back in triple digits. It's important to be prepared in case you begin experiencing problems with your air conditioning unit or just need a preventative maintenance check.

According to energy.gov, furnaces and air conditioners need their filters cleaned and changed every couple of months. A dirty filter can also increase energy costs and damage equipment. Maintaining your home's heating and cooling systems can improve the overall air quality of your home, cut energy costs and help alleviate allergies. If your AC needs a bit of work or isn't cooling properly, annual spring maintenance can help improve efficiency and prolong the life of your unit. In 2019, Better Business Bureau (BBB) received 2,800+ complaints regarding HVAC contractors nationwide. These complaints can range up to \$1,500 in financial loss and common issues deal with billing, the quality of workmanship or lack of proper permits.

As a homeowner, you should also always be on the lookout for red flags of unreliable businesses. BBB warns against these signs for untrustworthy AC Contractors or any other home improvement services:

- **Start with research.** Visit <u>bbb.org</u> to see a business's profile and check their complaint history and customer reviews. BBB Request-A-Quote is a tool allowing you to get fast quotes from accredited businesses. Ask for referrals from trusted people.
- Verify licenses. Often, low rated businesses in this industry don't have the proper licenses to do repair or installation work. Verify with Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (TDLR.texas.gov/LicenseSearch) that they have updated licenses matching the business name.
- Avoid high pressure tactics. Typically, they might try this by offering you a great deal and saying its only good right then. In most cases, if a deal is good one day, it will be good the next. Be especially careful with door-to-door solicitors who might not be working with legitimate businesses.
- Get everything in writing. Another common complaint is warranty issues. Getting everything in writing can help your case if you find yourself in this situation. Get up to 3 estimates and make payment using reliable methods such as check or credit card.
- Asks for a large upfront payment. A typical payment schedule should follow the "Rule of Thirds." The first payment is given when signing the contract and helps pay for materials, the second payment when work begins, and the final payment when the job is finished, and you are satisfied with the quality of work.
- To find a trustworthy AC Repair company, file a complaint or leave a positive review, visit <u>bbb.org</u>.

Mold management

Last summer's drought and the recent rains are good for this year's bluebonnet and wildflowers, but it can also lead to an unwelcome biological growth at home: mold.

It lurks in the corners and can cause major damage and nasty health issues.



As long as moisture and oxygen are present, mold can grow indoors or out on virtually any organic substance, including wood, paper, carpet, insulation and food. When excessive moisture accumulates in buildings or on building materials, mold growth will often occur, especially if the moisture problem remains undiscovered or unaddressed.

It is impossible to eliminate all mold and mold spores in the indoor environment. However, mold growth can be controlled by keeping moisture in check. Moisture control is key – mold cannot grow without it.

Left untreated, mold gradually destroys the material on which it is growing. Because molds produce allergens, irritants and toxins, they have the potential to cause a variety of health problems and can exacerbate existing conditions, such as asthma.

If mold is a problem in your home, clean up the mold and get rid of the excess water or moisture. If an area becomes water damaged, it is important to dry that space and any damaged items within 24-48 hours to prevent mold growth. Fix leaky plumbing or other sources of water to prevent recurrence. Wash mold off hard surfaces with detergent and water and dry completely. Absorbent materials (such as ceiling tiles and carpet) that become moldy may have to be replaced.

How to make Cascarones

Cascarones, those vibrant, confettifilled eggshells, are a delightful tradition at Fiesta time in San Antonio. Originating from Mexico, these colorful creations bring an extra dose of joy to any celebration. Making cascarones is not only a fun activity but also a creative way to add flair to your festivities. Here's a simple guide to crafting your own:



Ingredients

- **Eggs:** Start by gathering empty eggshells. You can either crack the eggs carefully to preserve the shells or use a small tool to create a small hole at the top of each egg and drain the contents.
- **Confetti or colored paper:** Choose brightly colored tissue paper or cut up scraps of colored paper to fill your cascarones.
- **Glue:** You'll need a non-toxic glue to seal the holes after filling the eggs.
