COYOTE SIGHTINGS IN YOUR AREA

Typical Urban Covote Behavior

- May be heard or spotted at a distance during the day or night
- May cross through yards or driveways when humans are NOT present
- · Skittish and easily scared off by noise or approaching humans

What to do:

Call the Coyote Hotline at 469-676-9813 to report the coyote to Dallas Animal Services. This hotline is a data-gathering tool that goes to a voice mailbox. Please leave your contact information. Calls are monitored and documented 7 days a week

Concerning Coyote Behavior

- . Enters yards, porches, picnic areas, or other spaces frequented by
- Is not easily scared off or startled
- · Steals food off of porches



What to do:

Employ hazing methods to let the coyote know that they are not welcome. Make noise, wave your arms, toss objects near (not at) the coyote, spray them with a hose or otherwise annoy or scare the coyote until they leave. Then, call the Coyote Hotline and follow the instructions listed below.

What to record Address of copide encounter, time of encounter, discipline of encounter, whether having effects were successful in starting and scaring off the copide, if the copide was spatied eating trash or food meant for humans or pels, whether children or pels were present, and any signs of illness or injury

Brush and Bulky Trash

Brush and bulky items may be set out beginning on the Thursday prior to collection week through Sunday prior to collection week. Materials must be placed at the curb by 7:00 A.M. the Monday of the pickup week. Our neighborhood is scheduled for the second **Monday week collection** of every month in 2024.

- Brush and bulky items must be placed just behind the curb line in front of your home.
- Do not place on the side of your home, in an alleyway, or on property across from or adjacent to your home.
- Do not place in the street, on the sidewalk, or in any manner that will interfere with vehicular or pedestrian traffic or with solid waste collection service.
- Do not place within 5 feet of a roll cart, mailbox, fence or wall, water meter, telephone connection box, parked cars, fire hydrant, utility pole, or traffic sign.
- Do not place under low hanging tree limbs or power lines, in an alley, or in front of a vacant lot or business.
