


Whether it's high school or college, completing this milestone is a significant achievement. As you step into the next chapter of your life, here are some words of encouragement:

Protect Yourself in the Heat

San Antonio is notorious for extreme heat in the summer. For any of our residents who are new to the area or not accustomed to our harsh summers, please take some extra time to be careful. Be sure to drink sufficient water and limit outdoor exposure as much as possible. Knowing the warning signs of overheating can save a life. If you know you normally sweat and identify that you are hot but not sweating, this is a medical emergency. Please watch out for your family and neighbors as well, often we do not identify the signs in ourselves. Also, think of your pets and animals. When the temperature is 95 degrees Fahrenheit outside, pavement can easily and quickly exceed 125 and blacktop asphalt can be 140!


