## A Note from Your...

Well the heat is upon us again! But in a welcome turn for San Antonio, this year the heat is accompanied by some degree of precipitation to help with our green spaces.

People have been out and about for the past few months, which is great to see, but please keep in mind that we all need to share our roadways with one another. For motorists this means keeping speeds within our

posted limits (we are a 30MPH zone, which is a maximum even on straightaways, and I have personally seen some cars doing 40 - 50), making sure to slow down around turns with the expectation there will be pedestrians around the corner -- including and especially in the evening / night hours when people may be taking advantage of cooler air, and keeping keen eyes on the road at all times and not on cell phones. Local streets with children and activity is wonderful, but far more unpredictable than main city routes or highways so if you're going to risk multitasking, please do not do so on our local streets. For those enjoying the roads on foot, pedals or paws, please keep a close eye on children to prevent dangerous activity, be courteous (and safe) and keep to the sides of the road allowing ample space for motor vehicles to pass - there's no lawsuit worth getting injured for, and certainly no need to create risk between neighbors where it is unnecessary.

Speaking of green spaces we continue to need volunteers to help with our gardening / landscaping committee providing advice and providing some manpower to keep our neighborhood as nice as it is. I know we're all very busy, but please consider donating a little of your time to your local neighborhood management. Interestingly I recently found myself in two unrelated conversations worth noting. The first was at a table of local folks where I heard how horrible HOAs are from people that aren't in one.

After quietly admitting I am not only a member of one, but President, I had to agree with most of what they had to say, although I also feel HOAs can play an important role. HOAs can get into people's business where they shouldn't, they have quasi-governmental powers but operate as private organizations, are costly, and they can be utilized as weapons to attack neighbors. Lucky for us, our HOA isn't abusive due to decades of heartfelt effort and contribution by well-meaning residents, many of whom have understood the dangers. Still, there are decisions to be made and disagreements happen; my solution has been to get involved -- it's just a few hours per year, be there for the discussions and the decisions, and do my part to keep the HOA fun, useful, and economical.

The second conversation was about it being 2024 and an election year. Are you sick of politics yet? Even if you're not, I imagine as the year grinds on toward Election Day it's only going to get less and less bearable. It seems all sides suggest the world is coming to an end; so the question came up - 'what can we do anyway to have any impact?' There were various answers and a few made sense but one stuck out: instead of spending mental energy worrying about national propaganda and following headlines about which you have virtually no sway, are there ways you can make an actual difference in your world directly in front of you? Getting involved in the decisions of your own neighborhood, helping your neighbors enjoy fun events, nice spaces, and safety in a way that makes the most sense to you is something you can do right here at home. #### Mailbox Break-Ins and Mail Theft Tips

Our community recently gathered for an important conversation on the prevalent issue of mailbox break-ins and mail theft at our District 8 Breakfast with the Councilman event. While USPS is overseen by the federal government, this issue is affecting neighbors across our district and the city, so we want to share the most helpful tips and insights from Michael Martinez-Partida, the USPS Postal Inspector.

- Regular Mail Retrieval: It is imperative to pick up your mail daily as promptly as possible. Allowing mail to accumulate in your mailbox is akin to leaving a valuable item, such as a laptop, unattended in your car.
- Informed Delivery: Utilize Informed Delivery by USPS to receive mail and package updates via email, the online dashboard, or the USPS Mobile app. Learn more here: https://www.usps.com/manage/informed-delivery.htm
- Hold Mail Service: When planning to be away from home, consider utilizing the USPS Hold Mail service. This service ensures your mail is securely held at the local Post Office until your return for a period of up to 30 days. Learn more here: https://www. usps.com/manage/hold-mail.htm
- Neighborhood Cooperation: Foster relationships with your neighbors. If you anticipate being away during a mail delivery, ask a trusted neighbor to retrieve your
- Report Suspicious Activity: Stay vigilant and report any suspicious vehicles. If possible, note the license plate number or unique characteristics, such as bumper stickers. Remember to prioritize your safety and refrain from putting yourself in danger.
- Monitor Finances: Regularly monitor your bank accounts and scrutinize credit card statements for any signs of suspicious activity.

According to the USPS Postal Operations Manual, the HOA is responsible for mailbox replacement. Oakland Heights HOA leadership is proposing the installation of a secure mailbox pavilion to create a safer environment for their neighborhood. Talk to your HOA to see what security measures might be best for your neighborhood.

Let's remain proactive in safeguarding our community against the threat of mailbox break-ins and mail theft. By implementing these strategies and fostering a sense of collective responsibility, we can work towards a safer and more secure community. If you have been a victim of mailbox break-ins or mail theft or would like to know the steps to report such incidents, see chart.

A friendly reminder of the HCN Covenants, Codes and Restrictions (CCRs) for all of us to help maintain a neat and beautiful neighborhood and to be considerate of our next-door neighbors:

• "Grass, weeds and vegetation on each lot sold shall be kept mowed at regular intervals. Trees, shrubs, vines and plants which die shall be promptly removed from the property. Lawns must be properly maintained, fences must be repaired and maintained, and no objectionable or unsightly usage of lots will be permitted which is visible to the public view."

• "Maintenance of the 'Subdivision Wall' is the obligation of the respective owners of the lot on which the Subdivision Wall is located. The term 'Subdivision Wall' shall mean any, and all parts of the (brick) wall on the perimeter of the Subdivision located along Lockhill Selma and Huebner Roads.
