The Latest on Northern Hills

It's already that time of year that we need to begin our Spring cleaning. The first step is to look around and see what needs to be placed on our "to do" list. For most of us it includes the yard, garage, closets, other storage locations, etc. A smart plan is to focus on only one specific area at a time. If not, it's easy to become overwhelmed. Some good news is that we will have an opportunity to get rid of a lot of unneeded "stuff" at our May 3rd Neighborhood Garage Sale and our May 10th Neighborhood Clean Up Day. We should donate to Goodwill, Salvation Army, and other charities those items that are too valuable to throw away. Please call our Garage Sale and Clean Up Manager **Kathy Green** at **210-627-0153** to learn more about these events.

Another item for the "to do" list is disaster preparation. Both SAWS and CPS regularly remind us that we need to plan for possible utility interruptions due to flooding, strong winds, freezing or ultra hot temperatures, fires, street repairs, and more. Do you have a working flashlight, extra stored food and water, or remember where you left the car and house keys? At the top of the list must also be emergency contact phone numbers and the numbers of our nearby neighbors. They need to be warned of various incidents, and our elderly residents must be called to make sure they are safe.

Other actions we should plan for include protecting important documents and items, such as titles, wills, medical records, passports, checkbooks, and cash. Likewise, we must be prepared to evacuate our homes in the event of a serious incident. Think about the people in those California wildfire locations, and what they forgot to take with them.

At the last NHHA General Meeting, our SAFFE Officer **Greg Warrington** explained additional actions we should take to protect our homes, family members, and neighbors. They included making sure emergency responders can quickly locate a specific house because the street numbers can be clearly seen on the front and back of the homes. He reminded us that we should have secure locks on our doors and windows, good night lighting, and security cameras. He also encouraged us to park our vehicles in the garage and not on the street and warned us about the growing trend of "porch pirates" who cruise behind

OVERSIZED VEHICLE PARKING By Ray Blankenburg

From time to time, we see campers and motorhomes parked on our streets. The city ordinance under section 35-370, Residential Oversized Vehicles and Recreational Vehicle Parking Exceptions states "Trip preparation time shall be limited to a maximum of 48 hours prior to use and 24 hours after use twice within any calendar month". You may wonder how they established 48 hours. The refrigerator in most recreational vehicles is not the same as our home refrigerator. It takes close to 48 hours from the time it's plugged in to reach maximum operating temperature.
