A Note from the President, Jackie Sundt

Dear Residents,

Summer is just weeks away, so please stay alert as you drive around the neighborhood. There will be more children on their bikes, walking with friends, and hopefully enjoying our park!

Good news! You are now able to pay your annual dues electronically! Inside this issue is information with the link and a QR code to make payment. There are a couple of important points for residents to be aware of regarding annual dues:

- 1. There is a fee incurred when making an electronic payment. You will notice when you open the link, it will indicate a payment due of \$16. The extra dollar is to cover the convenience fee charged by the platform.
- 2. Payment will not be accepted until you input your name and address to ensure your account is properly credited.
- 3. You will receive an emailed receipt once you have submitted your payment.
- 4. If you would like a Statement of Accounts, please send your request to members@ oakvillagenorth.org. Be sure to include your name and address in your request as we can't necessarily identify you by your email address.
- 5. Please consider making a donation to assist us in covering our annual expenses. The only reason we are able to cover our expenses is due to the generous residents who make donations above and beyond the required \$15. You can include your donation in your payment, or if you prefer you can conduct two transactions.
- 6. If you have a question or concern regarding your dues, please email me at president@oakvillagenorth.org.

In our April meeting, we had a discussion about the upcoming proposed amendments. As a reminder, we will be voting on two amendments. The first amendment would be to raise our annual dues. The second amendment would be to move our Deed Restriction renewal to an automatic renewal process. What does that mean exactly?

Currently, our Deed Restrictions in all three units have to be renewed every ten years. If we approve automatic renewal, this would mean the Deed Restrictions would automatically renew as they are written. It is against Texas Property Code 209 for Deed Restrictions to change without the approval of residents. Any change requires that 67% of residents approve the change through a ballot process which is mailed to every resident. Without the 67% approval, a change cannot be made. In short, the Deed Restrictions would automatically renew but there would not be any change to the document unless a vote is held to consider the requested change.

At our May meeting, we will finalize what the timeline will be for residents to vote. We have tentatively planned to put both proposed amendments to the community at the same time. We will be finalizing the ballot and the letter explaining the amendments at our May meeting. Thank you for your continued support!
