Hello to all,



Sun Safety Tips

It's natural to enjoy all kinds of outdoor activities! The Sun Safety Alliance (SSA) encourages you to be safe by following these sun-safety tips year-round to help prevent serious skin damage—and possibly skin cancer later.

- Keep in mind the sun is strongest between 10am and 4pm.
- Wear clothing that's dark and tightly woven.
- 3. Wear a wide-brimmed hat and sunglasses.
- 4. Remember that UV rays bounce off sand, snow, concrete, and water.
- 5. Do not use sun tanning beds.
- Keep babies and very young children out of the sun.
- Sunscreens need to be applied liberally and evenly over all exposed areas.
- 8. Apply sunscreen with SPF-15 or higher. Use products that provide broad spectrum protection, which

- means protection against both UVB and UVA rays. Seek products that contain ingredients like Avobenzone (Parsol 1789) or zinc oxide.
- 9. For children, the SSA recommends sunscreen with an SPF 30 or higher.
- Apply sunscreen before going outdoors and reapply often.
- 11. Reapply sunscreen after swimming, perspiring, and toweling off.
- Provide complete sunscreen coverage for your skin (including neck, ears and lips!).
- 13. For people with thin or thinning hair, apply sunscreen to the scalp as well.
- 14. Stay in the shade whenever possible.

About SAPD Central SAFFE

SAN ANTONIO FEAR FREE ENVIRONMENT The central core of SAPD's Community Policing activities is the SAFFE (San Antonio Fear Free Environment) Unit. First established in 1994-95 with 60 officers and supervisors, then enlarged in 1996 with an additional 40 officers, the SAFFE Unit consists of officers who focus on identifying, evaluating and resolving community crime problems with the cooperation and participation of community residents. SAFFE officers are assigned to specific areas or neighborhoods within the city, and work closely with both residents and the district patrol officers also assigned to those areas. SAFFE officers establish and maintain day-to-day interaction with residents and businesses within their assigned beats, in order to prevent crimes before they happen. SAFFE officers also act as liaisons with other city agencies, work closely with schools and youth programs, coordinate graffiti-removal activities, and serve as resources to residents who wish to take back their neighborhoods from crime and decay.

Oak Wilt continues to be an issue in our neighborhood. This was confirmed by a Certified Arborist with the Texas A&M Forest Service. It is important that you be aware of the symptoms as you examine the trees in your yard. There are ways to treat your trees for this disease. We have included an article in this newsletter the gives more information on how to recognize, prevent and treat Oak Wilt.



OAK WILT IN TEXAS

Oak wilt is an infectious tree disease caused by a fungus. All oak trees are susceptible to this potentially deadly disease. Thousands of acres in Central Texas have already been affected by oak wilt.

WHY SHOULD YOU CARE?

Oak wilt can impact entire communities. Infected trees usually die if they are not treated quickly by a qualified arborist. This can affect aesthetics, decrease property value, and be expensive to manage. Ignoring this disease is costly. Prevention is key.

HOW DOES IT SPREAD?

Above Ground By Beetles: The oak wilt fungus can produce spores on red oaks that it has killed. These spores are inadvertently transported by beetles feeding on the fungus. If these beetles land on a fresh wound or pruning cut on an uninfected oak, the spores may enter and infect a new tree.

Below Ground Through Root Connections: Once a new infection starts, the fungus may spread from tree to tree through an interconnected root system. Trees as far as 200 feet apart or more may be at risk. The fungus can spread as rapidly as 75 feet per year.

HOW TO RECOGNIZE OAK WILT

Look for defoliation and death of oak trees expanding from a central location. Live oaks will typically defoliate and die in 3-6 months while red oaks may die within 4-6 weeks. The most characteristic symptom of oak wilt is yellow and brown leaf veins in live oaks known as veinal necrosis. Sweet smelling fungal mats may form under the bark of dead red oaks in the spring. Laboratory isolation of the fungus is recommended to confirm the diagnosis. When in doubt, a trained expert should be consulted.







GET HELP

If you suspect that your tree has oak wilt or you need more information on how to prevent oak wilt, contact

HOW TO REDUCE THE RISK OF OAK WILT

- · Avoid pruning oak trees from February 1 to June 30.
- · Make proper pruning cuts.
- · Paint all oak wounds/cuts/stumps immediately with any type of paint.
- · Never store infected red oaks for firewood use.

HOW TO MANAGE OAK WILT

- · Prevent new infections by following the steps above.
- Improve landscape resilience by planting diverse tree species.
- If your trees are affected or at risk, consult with an Oak Wilt Qualified Arborist.
- Trench at least 4 feet deep and 100 feet away from trees with symptoms to stop the spread of oak wilt through tree roots.
- Preserve high-value trees with propiconazole fungicide injections.
 Fungicide does not stop root transmission of the disease, but it can save individual trees.
- · Burn, bury, or chip infected red oaks.
- · Communicate with neighbors to monitor the infection area.



We are currently in Stage 3 Water Restrictions

The hours you can water have changed.

LANDSCAPE WATERING

Landscape watering with an irrigation system, sprinkler or soaker hose is allowed only once a week from 5 – 10 a.m. and 9 p.m. – midnight on your designated watering day, as determined by your address.

Stage 3 restrictions begin when the 10-day rolling average of the Edwards Aquifer level drops to 640 feet mean sea level at the monitored well. Coming out of drought stages can be considered 15 days after the aquifer is above the trigger.

- All restrictions from Stage 1 and Stage 2 remain in effect unless added to or replaced by Stage 3 rules.
- Landscape watering with an irrigation system, sprinkler or soaker hose is allowed only once a week from 5 10 a.m. and 9 p.m. midnight on your designated watering day, as determined by your address. Weeks when no watering is allowed will be announced via local media and online.
- Watering with drip irrigation is allowed every Monday and Friday, but only from 5 a.m. – 10 a.m. and 9 p.m. – midnight.
- Watering with a hand-held hose is allowed any time on any day.

- All residential fountains and indoor commercial fountains can operate at any stage of drought. Outdoor commercial fountains must have a SAWS variance in order to operate during drought stages 1 through 4.
- Washing impervious cover such as parking lots, driveways, streets or sidewalks is prohibited. Health and safety exceptions may be requested from SAWS here.
- Residential car washing allowed during drought once per week on Saturday or Sunday as long as there is no water waste.
- The use of SAWS-certified commercial car wash facilities is allowed any day.

Drought Surcharge


For single family accounts, the Stage 3 surcharge of \$10.37 per thousand gallons will take effect for water use above 20,000 gallon a month.
