Neighborhood Leaves: As we enjoy this beautiful Spring season, let's keep our streets and yards looking their best. Blowing leaves into the street and leaving them there might seem like an easy fix, but it's not cool—those leaves can easily blow back into everyone's yards, creating extra work for all of us. Please take a moment to bag or mulch them instead. A little teamwork goes a long way in keeping our neighborhood tidy and neighborly. We appreciate everyone doing their part.

Trail Update: After in depth discussions between the HOA BOD and the City of San Antonio, we were unable to reach an acceptable solution regarding the usage of HOA property to extend the city bike trail system. No additional discussions are planned at this time or in the foreseeable future. The greenbelt area in question will remain an undeveloped portion of HOA property.

Stage 2 Water Restrictions: Please consider this a friendly reminder that, as of this writing, San Antonio is in Stage 2 water restrictions, and SAWS is driving our neighborhoods and fining homeowners who violate the restrictions. To prevent any fines, please check your sprinkler system and coordinate with whoever watches your home for when you are out of town.

During Stage 2, watering with a sprinkler, irrigation system or soaker hose is allowed only between 7 AM and 11 AM and from 7 PM to 11 PM on residents' designated day, determined by the last number of a customer's residential address.

- 0 or 1 Monday
- 2 or 3 Tuesday
- 4 or 5 Wednesday
- 6 or 7 Thursday
- 8 or 9 Friday

Watering with a hand-held hose is allowed at any time on any day.

Swim Team Information: Vineyard Viper swim team practices start on 1 May and run until late June. For those new to our community, the Vineyard Vipers compete with other neighborhood swim teams across the San Antonio area. With its history stretching to the earliest days of The Vineyard, the swim team has proven to be a great way of involving kids in outdoor activities while bringing families together. It is also another community activity that would not be possible without many neighborhood volunteers.

Swim team leaders, in coordination with the HOA Board, have posted the practice and meet schedule for this summer. So please be advised of the dates listed below when planning outings to the pool. During all practices, the toddler pool and adult pool will remain open. In addition, one lane in the main pool will be made available upon request for residents who wish to swim at those times. This lane is not reserved but will be made available to any resident who requests it. We strive to find a balance between our swim team families and other residents' needs. On a similar note, the pool opens at 6 AM, and several adults swim laps at that time if you are looking for some camaraderie.

Pavilion Rental: Looking to host a summer gathering? The newly renovated neighborhood Pavilion is available for reservation. Residents can book it through the Spectrum Association Management website by selecting "Amenities" and then "Book Amenities" from the dropdown menu. Recent upgrades include fixed prep-kitchen plumbing that now drains efficiently to the outdoor sewer, an expanded and more accessible table storage area, a full-height backsplash behind the sink, and a fresh coat of paint with an epoxy floor finish. A drape now offers the option to separate the prep-kitchen from the serving space.

The prep-kitchen features a commercial-grade double sink, and we've added two USB/GFI outlets above the prep shelving. The arched wood doors to the serving area have been refurbished, hardware included, and a chair rail now protects the walls in the table storage space. We've widened an opening by removing a door and plan to install a light filter on the arched window to soften the sunlight in the prep-kitchen.

- Alcohol service requires a security guard at \$35/hour (minimum 3 hours), present from guest arrival to departure
- One homeowner may book per day

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
